Nestle Purina exchanged bins on Indian Point in the month of October. 3.21 tons of newspapers, magazines, junk mail, empty, clean cereal boxes, shredded paper and cardboard boxes cut to no larger than 24 inches will be used to make cat and dog litter and do not end up in landfills. This brings the grand total to 7.75 tons within a period of a year collected on Indian Point (April 2.52 tons, July 2.02 tons, October 3.21 tons). Indian Point Recycle Center opened in November, 2005. Thank you to those who recycle and have made this accomplishment possible.

Beautification account: Interest rate on the two \$1000 Certificates of Deposits were renewed in October at 5.25% rate. This is money earned from aluminum collection and is in a separate account managed by the Indian Point Women's Club.
